MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Prevention of Sexual Assault and Treatment of Victims

1. References: AR 600-20, Army Command Policy, 7 June 2006.
2. Intent: To establish US Army Garrison Schweinfurt policy on the prevention of sexual assault, treatment of victims, and accountability of those who commit these crimes.
3. Sexual assault is a crime defined as intentional sexual contact accompanied by force, threat, abuse of authority or when the victim does not or cannot consent. It can occur without regard to gender, spousal relationship or age of the victim. Sexual assault is a violation of Army core values, the UCMJ, federal and state laws. Leaders will take an active role in eliminating sexual assault. Leaders will provide a safe, respectful environment for a victim. Commanders will insure that the victims of sexual assault know that their concerns are being addressed and taken seriously. Leaders will also protect the rights of the accused.
4. Soldiers who are victims of sexual assault can choose to make a restricted or an unrestricted report.
  - a. Restricted Reporting. Soldiers confidentially disclose the details of his/her assault to specified individuals and receive the opportunity for medical treatment, advocacy, and counseling.
    - (1) Treatment occurs without triggering the official investigative process.
    - (2) A restricted report is made by contacting the Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC) 24/7 at 0162-271-1413. During working hours, the Schweinfurt Health Clinic at 354-6722 or CIV 09721-966722 or the Chaplains office may be contacted at 354-6135 or CIV 09721-966135.
  - b. Unrestricted Reporting. Soldiers disclose the details of his/her assault to law enforcement and an investigation begins. Victims may receive medical treatment, advocacy, and counseling.
    - (1) Unrestricted reporting allows Soldiers to report an assault to their chain of command, the SARC, the IVA, or to request healthcare providers to notify law enforcement.
    - (2) Soldiers may directly contact the Military Police at 354-6766 or CIV 09721-966766 or the Criminal Investigation Command (CID) at 354-6628 or CIV 09721-966628. Details regarding the incident will be limited to only those personnel who have a legitimate need to know.
5. Commanders and installation law enforcement personnel shall take all reasonable measures necessary to ensure that a Military Order of Protection is enforced.
